10.1 Arts in Ed Meeting update (AEC), from 11/6:

b. Janet Blum brought up Native American dance as optional field trip for 4<sup>th</sup> graders. It ties in with curriculum. it would need to be paid by schools (either PTOs or tax credit), so it will be up to individual administrators to decide.

c. Heather: presenting this month to principals the performances available that can come to ES. It was a first come/first serve basis, meaning that the quicker principals responded to Heather & what show they wanted, the more likelihood they were able to book that performance for their school.

d. JB: HS will bring performances to their feeder MS.

10.2 ACA stART event: present were Mandy Buscas, Director of Learning, Alex Nelson - ACA & Lynn Tuttle, State Dept of Ed and Artists from ACA roster.

Mandy Buscas: ACA had a 54% cut into their budget this year; about 42% of that cut is from the state. She stated that the ACA cut 0% into their Artists in Residence programs. This year there was a higher demand for it. Grants applications available in January.

New Person for Artist in Residence Coordinator: Alex (Nelson?). Kim no longer there and Mandy will be away for a bit.

Lynn Tuttle: Discussed dire situation AZ is in with education: Fed. Stimulus money non-existent for next year; that this year was a cakewalk next to what is coming our way. Parent coalitions are extremely important for our children and for Scottsdale specifically, more parents need to engage with SPC...(voice for our kids...go to legislation on their behalf).

10.3 Arts in Ed Performances: I was at an AEC board meeting on 11/7. One of the discussions was about performances and how receptive principals were about them. 6 different types for performances were offered to the principals for their schools. Looks like Child's Play will be coming to our school and is funded by the AEC. Dates and times, TBA.

11.1 Fall Fundraiser and Cookie Dough Sales Final Report - Dana Gapusan and I are thrilled to report that we more than exceeded our goal for both the fundraisers this fall! We had a goal of raising \$9000 and we totaled \$17,669! Our net profits for the fall fundraiser were \$15,200 and the cookie dough sales totaled \$2,468. 240 students sold the 1<sup>st</sup> fundraiser - 102 students sold cookie dough (42% of these students only sold cookie dough)

This was a presentation highlighting all of the special needs programs that are available in SUSD. Contact Rita directly if any parent has any questions or problems. Information packet is enclosed - highlights: Special Ed programs around the district vary from campus to campus. Collaboration is required. Parents are encouraged to bring in ideas, thoughts and opinions. They are entitled to certain rights. Child needs consistency with teacher style throughout education to integrate into next phase of life. i.e., college/tech school/intentional service. Many services available. Please pass this info. on to any friends, family etc. with young children who may have disabilities to get started at this critical time. There are statewide offices in Flagstaff, Phoenix and Tucson. PLEASE REFER FAMILIES TO RITA AND FOLLOWING ORGANIZATIONS Many workshops are available. parent organization classes, tolerance training, transitioning, [www.pacer.org](http://www.pacer.org), [kidsagainstbullying.org](http://kidsagainstbullying.org), [teensagainstbullying.org](http://teensagainstbullying.org). Pam Murphy of SEPAC (special ed. parent advisory council), Lois Healy -head of SPS special ed. Or to get started, call child's school/teacher to ask for an evaluation. It will be conducted within 60 days. May decide to set up IEP - individual education plan. There are IEP workshops to teach you how to advocate for your child. This is all at no cost to the family. Major point was made to let entire school know to reach out to special needs kids. For example, include them in the yearbook and other events on campus throughout the year. There are IEP workshops once a year to provide skill once again on how to advocate for your special needs child. All this info will soon be put on the SEPAC website and the School Fusion website. Once again, Lois Healy is the go to person. (480) 484-5032. approx. \$4 thousand average per child is all that is allocated. More time for staff training is needed. RTI - response to intervention program is available to get help for middle achieving kids who tend to fall through the cracks. 2EP - twice exceptional program - contact Laurel Hogate [www.twoeparents.com](http://www.twoeparents.com). or [twoeparents@yahoo.com](mailto:twoeparents@yahoo.com). this is a program for children who are gifted and also have a learning challenge. These children feel school subjects are either too difficult or too easy. They tend to be under identified because they can cover up disability due to their giftedness. Red flag for identifying these kids: they can be highly disruptive or have a very difficult time keeping them on track during homework. It cannot be understated how much these kids need to be identified for they tend to go one of two paths. Drug/suicide or highly successful. Small class sizes are recommended. 4th or 5th grade is when this condition usually shows up for children are now reading to learn instead of learning to read. The more we can identify these kids, the more programs we will get in the district. Right now the only specific program available is at Mountainside. Next Meeting: December 16th at 9:30 am.
